Securing Lines with
Patient Movement
September, 2022

Situation: A patient was transported from ICU to radiology for a CT scan. When moving the patient from the CT table back to the bed, the patient's central dialysis line was accidentally pulled out causing excessive bleeding.

Background: The patient was on a ventilator, with a subclavian central line, and arterial line and Foley catheter and required multiple staff to transfer from one bed to another.

Assessment: There was no clear communication among the staff members for ensuring all lines were secure and would not catch on anything during the transfer of the patient.

RECOMMENDATION: PAUSE PRIOR TO PATIENT MOVEMENT:

All staff should STOP, CLARIFY AND ENSURE lines/tubing are free from obstruction and risk for removal and will verbally agree this is the case.
****PRIOR to ANY movement of the patient!****
